Welcome to Leeds Queer Film Festival 2025: the 20th anniversary edition!

The first ever LQFF was in a squat in 2005, and we're delighted we're still going strong while staying true to our DIY roots. This year you'll have the chance to hear from those who remember the early days, and also share your own memories – including with Leeds Industrial Museum for a special upcoming exhibition on the history of film in our wonderful city.

When we packed up and left CLAY last year, we had no way of knowing it would be the last time we held LQFF there. We'll treasure the memories we made there, from the joyous abandon of a queer ceilidh to the debauchery of Wet Cake. We're so grateful to Jess, Marie, Charlotte, Thistle and the rest of the CLAY team for giving LQFF a home for so many years: there's a part of our festival that will always be synonymous with your fairy lights, tureens of curry and motley assortment of chairs. The departure of CLAY leaves a massive hole in Leeds's DIY arts and queer scenes.

This year though, we're really excited to be welcoming you all to a new venue, Heart in Headingley! Films in the main hall, food and social space next door, and an extra room on the first floor for workshops and a few special films we couldn't quite squeeze into the main track. As well as your usual assortment of queer films, thought-provoking discussions, and cheap vegan meals (from a tureen of course - some things never die) you'll also be able to sample the delights of Heart's Assembly Bar and Kitchen. Besides organising the main festival, this year we took some time to work on the accessibility of our events, and to become a Community Interest Company (get us). Our organisers Olivia and Barnaby still found time to curate an incredible double programme of Queer Shorts for Leeds International Film Festival. We're delighted to be showing a couple of those selections at our festival, including the winner of the Queer Short Film Competition, ¡Beso de lengua! (Thursday @ 6.45pm)

Being a CIC doesn't change LQFF's DIY ethos one bit, and we're still powered entirely by volunteers. We're really grateful for the support of Heart, Hyde Park Picture House, The Bookish Type, and everyone who's made it possible for the festival to happen this year. Big love, and here's to another 20 years!

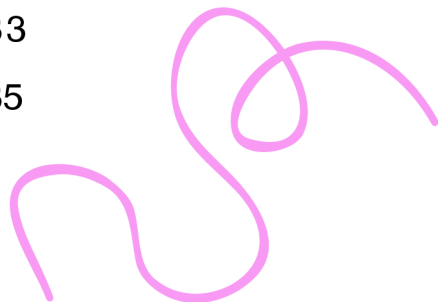

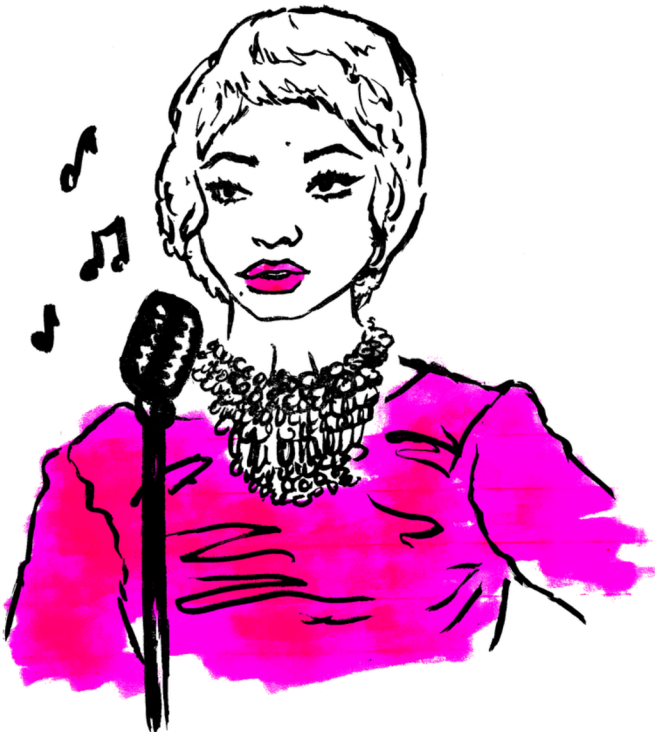

Any Other Way: The Jackie Shane Story

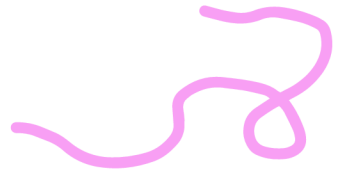
1hr 38min • Dir. Michael Mabbott, Lucah Rosenberg-Lee • 2024 • USA • English

An R&B star who once eclipsed Etta James and Little Richard, trans soul singer Jackie Shane blazed an extraordinary trail with an unbreakable commitment to her truth. Forty years after vanishing from public view, Jackie's story is brought to life in her own words through never-before-heard phone conversations, dazzling rotoscope animation and her amazing music.

Queer Exile

Ahmed flees Egypt during the 2011 revolution, resettling in Berlin. He struggles to find new community amidst far-right anti-immigrant sentiment in his new country. A film with a perfect blend of the poetic and political.

Dr. XYZ: A Medical Drag Transtholgy

Amrou Al-Kadhi's feature directorial debut explores the difficulty of being authentic in a world which wants you to dilute yourself. The film also represents the very real dangers facing queer spaces and the importance of our queer friendships for us to come together in good and bad times.

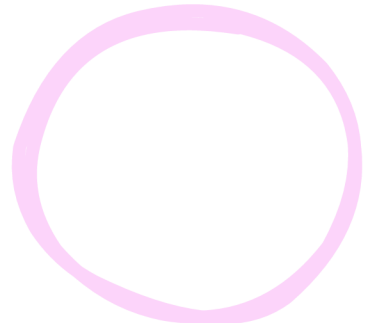

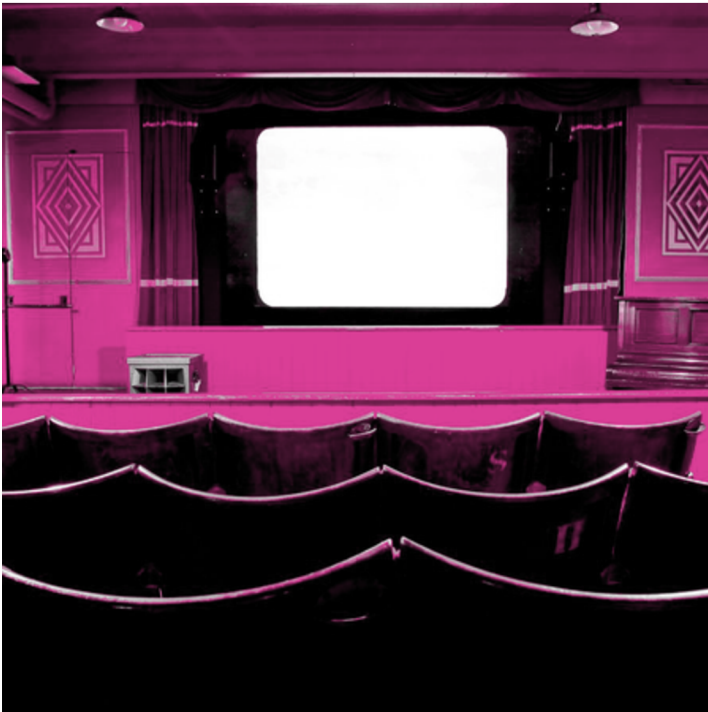

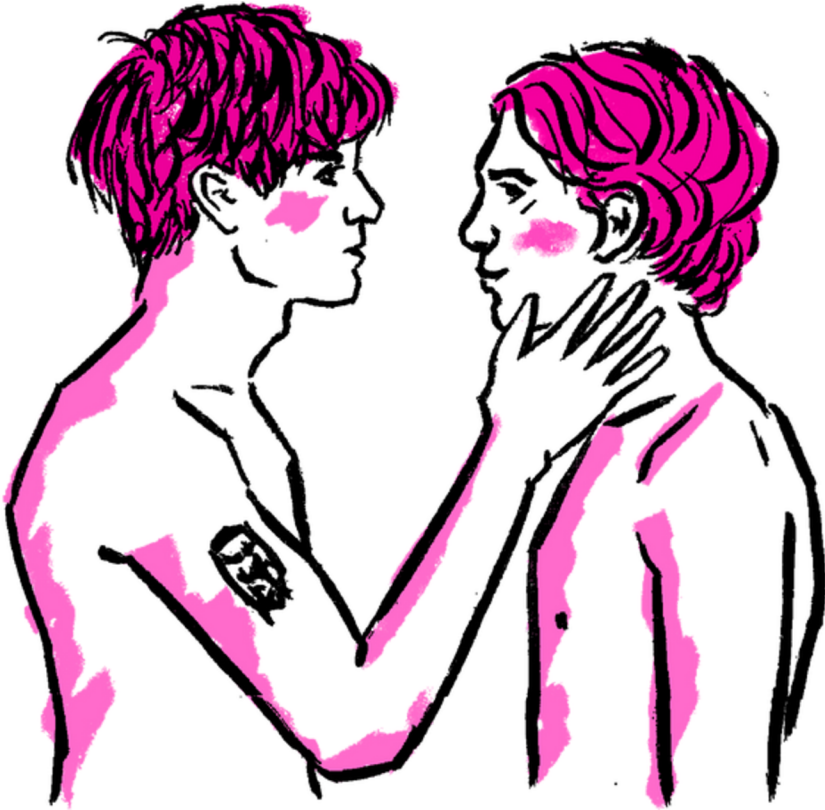

The HEART Centre is a Community Hub located in Headingley, North-West Leeds. This will be our home for the rest of the festival.

HEART Rooms

Shire Oak Hall:

The main screening room, located just past the reception on the ground floor.
Max Capacity: 100 seated

Claremont:

Smaller room located on the first floor, which will be used by the festival as an additional screening room.
Max Capacity: 30 seated

Buckingham Room:

Smaller room on the ground floor, found behind the main hall, where LQFF volunteers will be serving alternate food options to the ABK Café.

Beckett Room:

Small room located across from the main hall, will be a quieter space for crafts and relaxing.

ABK Café;

The ABK Café is HEART's café, which offers a wide range of locally sourced food and drink. The Café's opening hours are 9AM-8PM.

Please note: while LQFF will be the primary event at Heart this weekend, there will be a few regular community groups using other rooms throughout the festival, and the ABK Café is open to the general public.

SAFER SPACES



Leeds Queer Film Festival is a community event in a shared space. We strive to make that space welcoming; audience members, organisers, speakers and volunteers are all expected to act with care and respect. We would like people to think about the impact their behaviour may have on others and to act accordingly, and we know that some people do face abusive, oppressive and discriminatory behaviour in queer spaces.

The organising team behind Leeds Queer Film Festival have written a safer spaces agreement which can be found on our website and front desk at the festival.

ACCESS

All films will be screened with English **subtitles** and a few will have subtitles and captions.

Both venues are **wheelchair accessible**, however the automatic front door at HEART is somewhat temperamental. There will always be a staff member of volunteer available on-site to help open this door.

Parking: There are 4 dedicated blue-badge parking spaces on-site, with an additional 8 parking spaces, as well as bike racks. There is additional parking at the Headingley Taps (charges may apply).

Toilets: There are accessible toilets on each floor, with one also having a hoist for toilet use. Baby-changing facilities are available. LQFF and HEART will ensure that during the duration of the festival all toilets will be gender-neutral.

Seating: A range of seating is available in the screening room – chairs & bean bags, with some cushions available. If you need to enter the screening room first or need a particular place in the room please let an organiser know.

Please don't come if you have any viral symptoms, even if you're testing negative for **COVID**. Please take a lateral flow test before attending if available. A supply of free LFTs and FFP2 masks will be available. If you need to leave due to testing positive, we will refund your ticket.

All **Friday screenings** in the Claremont Room will be mask-mandatory.

The Beckett room in Heart will be a **quieter space** most of the time.

TICKETS



We are committed to making the festival affordable for everyone. We decided that a sliding scale was the best way to allow everyone to afford a ticket that is within their financial reach whilst also ensuring the festival can continue each year. We ask that you be honest with yourself and your financial situation. If you purchase a ticket at the lowest end of the scale when you could afford the higher ticket prices, it makes it harder for us to provide financial flexibility to those who most need it. A day ticket includes all films and workshops for that day. See next page for advance booking information.

TICKETING FAQs

What's the TL;DR on how tickets work?

Half the seats for each screening are available to book in advance, but you have to pick up (and pay for) your prebooked ticket in person at least 30 minutes before the screening, or you lose it. The other half of the seats will be available to purchase on the door. Festival pass holders have guaranteed seats for all screenings, but you also need to pick them up at least 30 minutes in advance.

Can I book in advance?

Yes – half the seats for each screening will be available to book on our website, leedsqueerfilmfestival.co.uk. You don't pay for it online, you just put your name down to reserve a space. Once you've booked online, you must come and pick up the booking in person – and pay for it – at least 30 minutes before the screening. If you don't, you might lose your booking. We take cash or card and you choose what to pay for the day ticket from £0-£12.

What does it mean if it says a screening is 'sold out' on the website?

It means all the advance seats have been sold – but the other half will still be available to book on the door, so do come down to Heart and check! If all the on-the-door seats for a screening get sold too, we'll post on our socials about it, so please keep an eye out.

Will you have a waiting list for sold-out screenings?

Yes. You can add your name to the waiting list on the door, and if any advance bookers or pass-holders don't pick up their seats, they'll be allocated to people on the waiting list on a first-come, first-served basis.

When do seat reservations become available on the door?

At the start of each day – so for example, when you turn up on Saturday morning, you can get seats for everything that's showing on Saturday. We take cash or card and you choose what to pay for the day ticket from £0-£12. A day ticket includes screenings of all films that day.

What if I have a festival pass?

We offer a limited number of full 5-day passes. This includes entry to all films (including the opening night) and the karaoke party. But just like with other advance bookings, you must come and pick up your seat reservations in person at least 30 minutes before the screening. If you don't, you might lose your booking. You can collect all your seats at once when you first arrive at the festival.

Can I reserve a specific seat?

Yes, if you have access requirements: let us know when you arrive, and we'll let you into each screening a few minutes early so you can get the type/position of seat you need. Otherwise, for non-access-related reasons, seating is first-come, first-served.

Can you squeeze a few extras in at the last minute, pleeeeeease?

Probably not this year! The space (and fire regs) at Heart is a bit tighter than it was at CLAY, so we're not gonna have any completely packed screenings this year – please plan accordingly.

How do tickets work for the opening night?

Tickets for Any Other Way: The Jackie Shane Story are available to purchase in advance at hph.co.uk or on the door. This screening takes place at Hyde Park Picture House and all tickets are on a sliding scale starting from £0.

FOOD AND DRINK

This year, our hosts at Heart and Hyde Park Picture House both have cafes, which we encourage you to enjoy.

Throughout the festival, in the Beckett Room, we will also be serving vegan hot meals, snacks and cake at low prices.
